# Things You Never Noticed in *A Christmas Story*

In 2009, a musical based on *A Christmas Story* premiered at the Kansas City Repertory Theatre, Missouri. Noted songwriting team Pasek and Paul did the music and lyrics for the show, while Joseph Robinette wrote the book. *A Christmas Story: The Musical* eventually made its way to Broadway in New York City in 2012.

*A Christmas Story* is based on a novel from Jean Shepherd called "In God We Trust: All Others Pay Cash." While the story takes place in the fictional town of Hohman,

Indiana, the movie was filmed in two locations: Cleveland, Ohio and Toronto, Canada. All of *A Christmas Story's* exteriors were filmed in Cleveland, while all of its interiors were shot in Toronto. Fun Fact: *A Christmas Story* was filmed during the winter, but there was not enough snow in Cleveland during production. A majority of the snow used in the film was trucked in from area ski resorts, or substituted with potato flakes and firefighter's foam.



## Chicken Curry Recipe

**PREP TIME** 10 minutes

**COOK TIME** 25 minutes

**TOTAL TIME** 35 minutes

**SERVINGS** 4

### Instructions

Heat the oil in large pot over medium low heat. Add the onions and minced garlic and cook for a few minutes until the onions are fragrant and softened.

Add the chicken and cook for 2-3 minutes, browning it a little. Add curry powder and paste; cook for 3-5 minutes.

Add the coconut milk, and let simmer for 15-20 minutes or until the chicken is fully cooked.

Add water or chicken stock depending on the consistency you want for the sauce, or let simmer longer to thicken if needed.

Stir in the brown sugar, fish sauce, and lime juice.

Top with fresh cilantro, serve over cooked rice.

### Ingredients

1 pound boneless skinless chicken breast chopped into bite sized pieces

1 Tablespoon vegetable oil

1 Tablespoon minced garlic

1 small yellow or white onion chopped

2 Tablespoons yellow curry powder

1 Tablespoon Thai red curry paste

15- ounce coconut milk canned, full fat

½ cup water or chicken stock optional

1 Tablespoon brown sugar

1 teaspoon fish sauce

2 Tablespoons lime juice

salt to taste handful of fresh cilantro roughly chopped

4 cups cooked white rice for serving
